

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord April 5, 2020

Dear Friends in Christ,

According to an update from the bishop that was sent on Wednesday, there will be no public liturgies during Holy Week, which begins with Palm Sunday and includes and ends with Easter Sunday. Even though we have been without public celebrations of the Mass for the last couple weeks, this may still come as a shock because only on rare occasions - if ever, for some - have we not celebrated the most important day of the Christian year. I will continue, as is my obligation, to celebrate the liturgies for the intentions and for the entire parish on Easter Sunday. It is also my intention to put together some kind of resource to help you enter spiritually into this sacred time even though it is hard to do so physically.

Palms will be blessed on Sunday and made available in the church at St. Mary for anyone who would like to stop in to get one and I encourage you to take at least a little time to pray as well. Please respect the distancing guidelines.

Church hours will vary on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday so that the liturgies are celebrated without interruption and to be in accord with diocesan guidelines. The exact timing has yet to be determined. For now, I estimate it will be closed around four on Thursday, two on Friday, and seven on Saturday. Regular hours should resume on Sunday. If you can, check the parish website to be sure before you come.

Lastly, not many people have taken advantage of FORMED, which is free to us for about another thirty days. I especially urge those parents who have a child preparing to receive a sacrament to sign up and watch the appropriate content since religious education is not currently meeting. It is very easy to sign up.

Mike Phelan is also home from the hospital and is thankful for all your love and support. He would love to talk to you, give him a call at 641-363-4584.



Readings and Questions for Faith Palm Sunday, April 5, 2020

Theme: Holy Week — the mystery of our faith.

Reading I: Isaiah 50:4-7 • The Lord God is my help.

Reading II: Philippians 2:6-11 • Your attitude must be

Christ's.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14-27:66 • The passion of our Lord.

Question for Children: Share how you sometimes make sacrifices for the good of others.

Question for Youth: Take time to really reflect on Jesus life, death and resurrection. How might you be changed?

Question for Adults: Name one specific way that you live your baptismal call to enter into the death of the Lord by forgiveness, generosity, hospitality, or other ways.

Hello from Me & My House! It's been a while, not only since you heard from me but also since we've all been able to gather together.

I've tried to come up with a word or two that can describe how I'm feeling. Overwhelmed and unsettled are the best ones I can think of and even then, I still can't give you a great explanation behind it. What's happening is a lot for all of us. But I do have some reflections that have helped me, and I wanted to share them with all of you.

Grace. It has been on my heart so many times lately. Give some grace to our leaders making big decisions that affect so many people. Give some grace to everyone even if they are acting in ways that are hard for you to handle. This is a new territory for everyone and each of us will react in different ways. We will go through stages and have a different reaction today than we had yesterday. And leave a little grace for yourself. Be patient and remember that all the things you're feeling are okay and you are not alone.

In the words of Governor Reynolds, "This is a marathon, not a sprint." We are literally at a standstill and cannot make plans past the next 2 weeks, so what better time than now to slow down and take things in strides. Humans can be overwhelmingly wasteful, selfish, distracted and sinful. It's time to slow down and get yourself back to the basics. Pray, as much and as often as you can. Pull out your bible and start that study you've been wanting to do. Prioritize laughter and connections. Take the opportunities you are given to connect with people through technology. Sit down and write a letter. Let people know you are thinking about them. Check on your loved ones and your neighbors and help others in any way that you are able.

Stay inside, keep washing your hands and pray for us all. *Together is the best way to overcome anything*.
