Jesus was constantly in community with his followers and with those he encountered in His ministry and that is recorded in the Gospels. He shared food and love with His community and wished that for all people. That is why a gathering like the picnic, or wine and cheese, or coffee and donuts is actually important for us to participate in as we grow in our faith. It doesn't take Father Andrew to be present in vestments for the action to be beneficial and authentically Christian!

With that said, please join in any gathering of parishioners for whatever event is held in our parish community.


