

Fasting & Abstaining From Meat

Everyone 14 years and older are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

Everyone 18 years old and under 59 years old are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these days, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals together should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juice are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, this does not apply.

Sacrament of Reconciliation... attending weekday Mass... making use of the reflection resources available in the vestibule. Welcome Jesus more fully into your life and let him be the anchor of your soul.

As the children prepare for First Holy Communion we are focusing on different parts of the Mass in our presentations. Gestures are an important part of the Mass and it is so satisfying to explain them to the children. The first gesture we explain is the Epiclesis. This gesture happens when Father lowers his hands over the bread and the wine and calls down the Holy Spirit to change them into the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. In our parish, a single solitary bell rings to set this moment apart.


One Lenten Meal Still Needs Hosting
