The problem with that is that I keep a hard calendar and an email helps me to keep track of things better. You can call me either Fr. Ross or Fr. Parker I have no preference on that. Some of my interests outside of ministry are exercise (you may see me out walking or running), reading, cooking, watching the Chiefs/Hawkeyes, and hanging out with my family. Again, I am so honored to be with you. It feels good to have some stability in my life. I look forward to growing in virtue and holiness with all of you!


