DIACONATE FORMATION OF JOHN FISHER



We are just a few months from ending our second year of the diaconate formation process. We have enjoyed our first two years. John has been very busy with classes and homework. We have a pretty large cohort and have made a lot of amazing people that have become good friends and amazing prayer partners.

For the past two years we have met as a cohort one Saturday a month (except on zoom during bad weather) and weekly on zoom. In addition to that, John has taken 10 classes so far. He has enjoyed

learning so much from the classes like the history of the Bible and the diaconate. He said his favorite class so far is the Pentateuch class. For those that are wondering what class that is, it is the study of the first five books of the Hebrew Bible (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy).

John has had to relearn to study, which has been good, yet challenging. He has been surprised and excited to learn that the Bible is more than a history book. It's a library made with poetry, history, liturgy, and law. It has helped him understand Mass and the bible so much more.

Andrea has enjoyed the process the last two years, with her challenge being the schedule. Andrea has lost six family members in the past two years so that has made attending every session or zoom call a bit of a challenge. Overall the first two years have been grace filled and very fulfilling.

The next steps in the process will include a discernment retreat and a small group session with Bishop Joensen. If the bishop does offer an invitation to continue with the diaconate process, John will participate in the Rite of Candidacy in September.

Parishioner feature: Dan Harrington



Dan Harrington recently joined the church in February. Anyone who knows Dan knows about his strong faith and unwavering love for Jesus Christ. Here's a little more about him – stop him after church and introduce yourself if you haven't met Dan. He'll tell you exciting stories for sure!

Dan was born and raised in Ottumwa, IA and attended the Methodist church every Sunday where he was also involved in youth ministry. Church was a big part of his family life and through his senior year in high school hardly missed a Sunday. When he was 15, he accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior and at age 16 pledged his life to Him again. As Dan went through his adult life he attended several churches, but didn't find a strong fit so continued studying God's word on his own. Though his faith never wavered, he missed attending church. In his mid-30's while travelling for his job to Israel, Dan spent several days re-tracing where Jesus was born in Bethlehem, where He died, and some of the places He walked (Sea of Galilee). He even touched the Star of David in Bethlehem which was a faith "re-charge" for Dan. It was that moment that connected Dan with the Holy Spirit and guided his life from that point on.

If you have the opportunity to talk with Dan, he can tell you about his several "near misses" in life. He has come close to dying several times but believes the good Lord needs him here on earth. Dan has experienced precarious situations in other countries and has lost friends from unusual accidents. There have been several close calls. Dan attributes this to his strong faith; he always comes back to Christ who re-focuses him.

A couple years ago Dan lost his wife. Throughout that time, he continued to be faithful and accepted that Jesus was taking her back to His home. He felt proud that Jesus took her with Him to Heaven. As any good ending story would have it, he met Sue not long after! Their relationship was founded on faith and Dan believes Jesus gave Sue to him (and him to Sue) to support each other during their time on earth. After meeting Sue, it became clear to Dan that the Catholic church would fulfill his longing for a church. When Sue first took him to St. Mary's he was overwhelmed (everything was Greek to him!), but even so he could feel Christ's presence in the church. Father Ross and the people of the church were so welcoming, and it seemed natural from the get-go. As Dan continued attending church with Sue, he longed for taking communion and decided to join the church. When he comes to mass he feels re-charged and ready to face anything. Dan says "I can face anything without fear because He's there with me"!

Spring recipe

Colorful Spring Pasta Salad (submitted by Katie Fredericks)

1 package cooked cheese tortellini

½ can whole jumbo black olives

½ inch cut red, green, yellow peppers (plenty)
