



Philip, Apostle and Martyr, First Century

Philip was from Bethsaida in Galilee and is thought to have been a disciple of Saint John the Baptist when Jesus called him. In John's Gospel, it says Jesus "found Philip" and instructed him to "Follow me." Philip brought his friend, Nathaniel (Bartholomew), to Jesus. Philip was present at the marriage feast at Cana and at the feeding of the five thousand; where Jesus tested Philip, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?", he asked Philip. Philip, not recognizing that Jesus was about to perform a sign for all of them, replied, "Six months wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little." Jesus then took the five barley loaves and two dried fish and fed the crowd after which the disciples gathered twelve baskets of fragments of the barley loaves. Philip is the Apostle at the Last Supper who asks Jesus to show them the Father. Jesus responded to Philip, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father," which is a message to all of us. The Acts of the Apostles note that Philip was with the other ten Apostles in the upper room awaiting the Holy Spirit. Early Church Tradition states that Philip preached the Gospel at Phrygia and later died at Hierapolis, said to be crucified upside down. His remains were eventually brought to Rome and have been preserved in the basilica of the Apostles since A.D. 561.

Saint Philip shares a Feast day with the Apostle, James the Younger on May 3. Phillip's message today: Just as Jesus tested Philip about feeding the crowd, Jesus sometimes tests our faith with adversity. While these trials can seem overwhelming, we should remember that God is with us even when we cannot feel his presence. Do you trust that God is with you when you experience hard times in your life? Renew your trust that God is always with us.

Readings and Questions for Faith Sharing

Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy), April 15/16

Theme: Jesus gives us the power of the Holy Spirit.

Reading I: Acts 2:42-47 • They devoted themselves to a communal life.

Reading II: 1 Peter 1:3-9 • There is cause for rejoicing here.

Gospel: John 20:19-31 • Peace be with you, he said.

Question for Children: Even though you can't see him with your eyes, how do you "see" Jesus in others?

Question for Youth: Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit and gave us the power to forgive sins. How do you offer forgiveness to your friends and family? How do you seek forgiveness for yourself?

Question for Adults: When and how do you experience the "new birth" which we are given in Christ? When someone has forgiven you? When you have forgiven others? When you celebration reconciliation? At other times?
