Little Black Book

Find six minutes of quiet time every day to use this book a page at a time. That's within reach. The right hand page walks through the Passion according to Luke, with reflections and explanations along the way and on Sundays, it will take you through the Mass, explaining one part at a time. The other page has a variety of quotes, information, timely thoughts, many of which are centered around the Eucharist. This book begins Sunday before Ash Wednesday to give you three days to get ready for Lent.

The Season for Healing Hearts

Most people look at someone in trouble and think, "Somebody should help them." This Lent let your response be "I'm somebody! I should help!" We can all do something—call, listen, visit. Not difficult, but surely provides needed comfort. Jesus is saying, "Look at the people who are hurting. Let me bring healingthrough you." Get everything you can out of these pages and when Easter arrives you'll feel refreshed, renewed and ready to open your helping heart to hurting hearts.

Season of Love

For Families Daily Reflections, Prayers and Activities

Parents, if you find yourself overwhelmed by the thought of all you have to do during Lent, this little booklet is for you. Or, maybe Lent isn't registering as all that important for you and you are kind of neutral on it.
